Let me know: you wish just might be my command~


partner and Carson's near-constant companion.

So I haven't really mentioned much about "Pale Moon", mostly because I have been really focusing a lot of my attention elsewhere. But this month, I found myself inspired to work on it and it just makes me happy, so here goes!

"Pale Moon" is about a twenty-something named Shayne who is obsessed with the supernatural. Or, rather, he *was* before a werewolf chased him down and bit him, effectively dropping him into the plot of a paranormal novel. Still, he knows enough to seek out the head of a local pack of wolves and ends up tied to the Alpha's second in a mentoring relationship. Fallon is the epitome of a fantasy werewolf to Shayne, but he's hesitant to open himself up to the attractive older man. After all, the last group of people who were supposed to accept him no matter what tossed him out when they learned something they didn't like. How much more could a pack of wolves do when they learned the same thing? And how would he manage to keep his secrets with Fallon so close to him so much of the time?

I like writing about people struggling with their sexualities. Well, that may not be the way to say it: the struggle with sexuality makes a character deeper in some aspects, as well as relatable for many readers. So many people in my life have struggled with it, but almost as difficult to cope with is struggling with your sensuality, which I have definitely done. The reason it is so relatable is because it *isn't* rare that a person is uncomfortable in their own skin. Sometimes, it really takes a challenging event in our lives to make us stop denying it and face it head on. In my efforts to make Shayne a real person to myself and my readers, I have also thrown him one heck of a curve ball.

Emotional upheaval is frequently the only thing to make us face our problems in our lives and in our selves, and I hope to show that in this story.

I have to admit, right now I am rather biased and Ellery is my current favorite character in this setting. I think you will understand why better when you see his back story, but suffice to say that he has overcome so many things but he still has more to move past, including his past. He sort of... survived, but didn't really deal with it, and he's going to have to work through it if he will ever get to be happy.

It makes me sad that I appear to have made so little progress with this universe this month. The truth is, my real life job has kept me so busy that I have a hard time finding time to write. And even when I do find the time, I don't have time to type it up for you all.

This month, I'd like to explore something I've been working on for this universe –actually for one of my Samplings, so hopefully you will all get to see it soon! The prompt I'm working with is "Personal Demons" and as you have noticed, Ellery really is the character I have been focusing on.

First, however, I need to reveal a few things, the first of which is that my magick practioners (wizards, warlocks, and the like) are all throw-backs to "Dungeons & Dragons" character builds. I have taken a lot of liberties with them, but I've kept several things –like a warlock is half-Infernal (born of a union that included a daemon or a devil). This is really important and evident in Ellery Wylan, my wild wizard. Since he is a wild wizard, his magick forcibly made itself known in a plane where nothing is as it seems.

The second thing that you need to know about is the Hideaki, which is a secluded locale in Sada. What makes the Hideaki special is that it is a point where three planes meet: the material plane, the plane of good/light magick, and the plane of evil/dark magick. What happens in the place where they meet looks like something out of a H.P. Lovecraft story: the laws of reality, perceptions, and physics no longer applies, because the warring magicks have torn the plane to shreds. Nothing is as it seems and everything is warped through and by the magick.

The reason I mention all of these things is simple: *that place* is the deepest and darkest of Ellery's personal demons. The next Sampling I post should have a lot of detail about that nightmare realm.
